12 Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, 13 bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14 And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. 15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. *GOSPEL READING......John 21: 1-17

21 After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. ² Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. ³ Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴ Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵ Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered him, "No." ⁶ He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. ⁷ That disciple whom Jesus loved, therefore, said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. ⁸ The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards off.

⁹When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. ¹⁰ Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." ¹¹ So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. ¹⁴ This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

¹⁵ When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶ He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep."

¹⁷ He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep.

Nursery News

After receiving approval from our Church Council to convert the Upper Room into our new nursery, the Nursery Committee has swung into high gear! The official date for opening a fully-developed nursery is Rally Sunday, September 8, 2013. However, the Volunteer Recruitment and Training team has set an earlier goal for opening the



nursery with volunteer staff. Our goal is to welcome children to the temporary location (Hansel and Gretel Room) on July $14^{\rm th}$. We realize that we won't have everything quite ready, but will have the space and staff to care for the little ones while their parents attend worship services.



According to the Annual Conference guidelines, a church nursery should have people available each Sunday who are trained in CPR, first aid, choking, shaken baby, AED (for adults). To meet those criteria, a First Aid Training Course will be held on Saturday, August 24th, at Sacred Heart Church. We hope to have 5-7 have at least one trained person each Sunday available to assist in an emergency.

As a temporary step to meet our goal, Vada Dahnert will be calling congregation members to serve as nursery attendants. We hope to have one attendant and one helper ready to care for our children (ages newborn through age 4) by July 14th. Special training is NOT required for those first few weeks. You may call Vada (833-5477), Linda (835-1917) or the Church Office (835-3167) to volunteer. We have **eight Sundays to fill before Rally Sunday...**please help us get off to a flying start by volunteering for nursery duty NOW! Thank you for serving and loving the little children.
