RESPONSIVE READING.....**Psalm 42-43, The Message**

I'm on a diet of tears—tears for breakfast, tears for supper. All day long people knock at my door, Pestering, "Where is this God of yours?"

**All: These are the things I go over and over, emptying out the pockets of my life. I was always at the head of the worshiping crowd, right out in front, Leading them all, eager to arrive and worship, Shouting praises, singing thanksgiving—celebrating, all of us, God's feast!**

L: They're out for the kill, these tormentors with their obscenities, Taunting day after day, "Where is this God of yours?"
