WE NEED TO DO BETTER

The Council approved the budget plan for 2023 at its February meeting, but only after using nearly all of the savings balance we had. That savings (about \$36,000) was established three years ago from the Gov't payment we got by retaining all of our employees during the Covid downturn. We have had to tap into that balance each year in order to pay all of our bills.

The giving levels at Faith have not kept up to our needs. In 2022, an analysis of the giving by individual members show that about 50% of our members gave or exceeded what they pledged or what we had expected based on their past giving levels. The other 50% fell short. This also appears to reveal itself in the Sunday attendance at church.

Looking at the numbers another way, when we see the giving over two years, it has dropped steadily from \$304,968 in the 2015 – 2016 period to \$236,910 in the 2021 – 2022 period. This is not sustainable for our church. Unless our giving levels increase substantially, we will have to implement several major cost reductions.



Soap Closet

Faith UMC is participating with Minnesota Valley Action Council (MVAC) as a drop off site for their "Soap Closet". It is a program to help those in need with hygiene supplies in our county. The drop off box is located in the narthex. Items they are looking for include the following:
