From the Pastor's Desk

"Friends love all the time, and kinsfolk are born for times of trouble." — Proverbs 17:1

Dear Ones,

My brother Craig brought his grandson Rylan to visit during the first part of January. They live in Brandon Mississippi. Craig is four years younger than I am, which makes him 60, Rylan is 13. While they were here, we took a three-day trip to Sioux Falls where Craig and I spent a good deal of our school years. We took a whole afternoon to drive by all the houses Craig and I lived in growing up. We went past all the schools we attended and even the small neighborhood grocery store we would walk to for a snickers candy bar and vanilla cream soda. We visited the cemetery where our Mother, Father and brother Allan are buried. We told all kinds of stories about our childhood and youth. Some happy, some not so much. I have a feeling that Craig and I had a better time going down memory lane than Rylan did, but he did take delight in teasing us. He loved pointing out how Craig and I are basically the same person. We look alike, use the same phrases, our laugh is the same, he even made the observation, while at the pool, that our feet look exactly the same.

I often thank God for making us to live in families. Not everyone's biological family is a happy place, but most of us either bond with our birth family, or seek out others who form a family with us. As Proverbs tells us, our friends love us through everything and our kinsfolk are with us in trouble.

Our congregation is for us, a family of friends. The Psalmist tells us *"How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!"* Like most families, we don't agree on everything. We grumble and complain. But what I have witnessed is that, in the end, we pull together to get things done.

As we look forward, to our future together, I pray that we continue to live together in unity. I pray that together, we can see a new future, one that overcomes the obstacles put in our way by COVID and by apathy. I fear we have gone on too long waiting for "normal" to return. In March, I would like us to meet (with masks and social distancing) to reminisce about the past, and to plan for our future.

Our God sees a vision for us. God planted a United Methodist Church on the shore of Clear lake in Waseca Minnesota for a reason, and I believe that God is not done with us.

For the February meeting, the ladies are asked to bring something to do with Valentine's Day; valentines you have received, a poem, a memory or something to do with Valentines Day.


Sunday School Returns!





Jesus Loves Me

That Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith; that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height—to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Ephesians 3:17–19

Anna and Susan Warner lived in a lovely townhouse in New York City where their father, Henry Whiting Warner, was a successful lawyer. But the “Panic of 1837” wrecked the family’s finances, forcing them to move into a ramshackle Revolutionary War-era home on Constitution Island on the Hudson, right across from the Military Academy at West Point.

Needing to contribute to the family income, Anna and Susan began writing poems and stories for publication. Anna wrote “Robinson Crusoe’s Farmyard,” and Susan wrote, “The Wide, Wide World.” The girls thus launched parallel literary careers which resulted in 106 publications, eighteen of them co-authored.

One of their most successful joint projects was a novel titled *Say and Seal* in which a little boy named Johnny Fox is dying. His Sunday School teacher, John Linden, comforts him by taking him in his arms, rocking him, and making up a little song: “Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so”

The novel became a best-seller, second only to *Uncle Tom’s Cabin*; and when hymnwriter William Bradbury read the words of John Linden’s little song (written by Anna), he composed a childlike musical score to go along with them. “Jesus Loves Me,” soon became the best-known children’s hymn on earth.

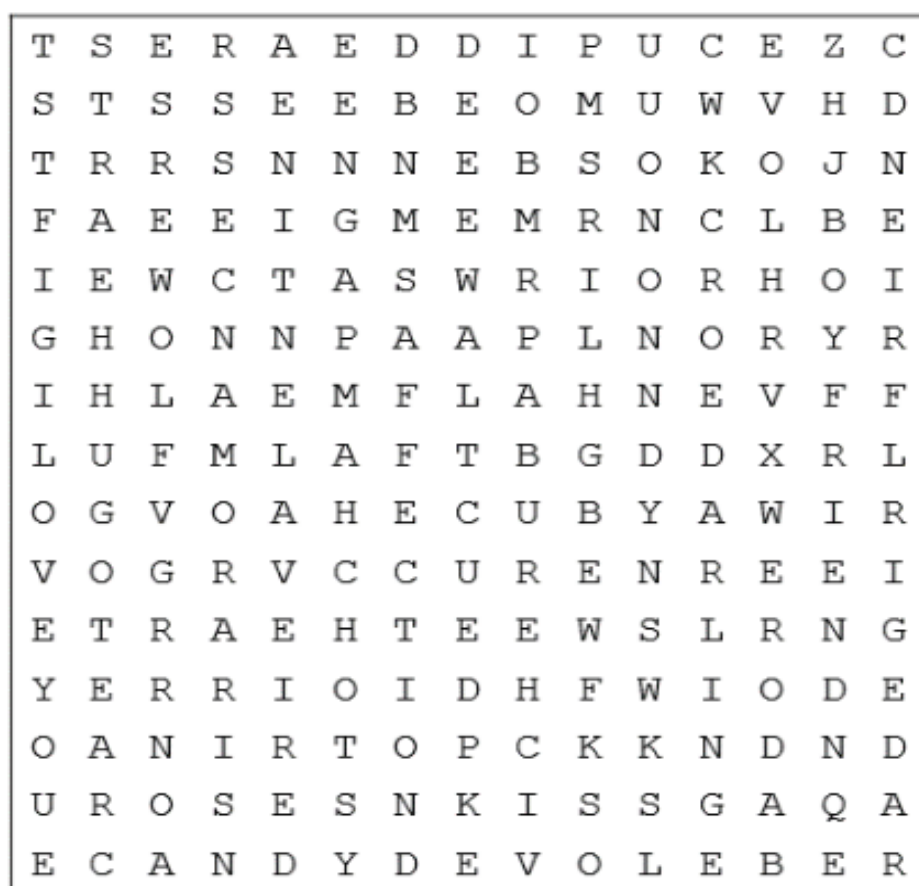
Despite their success, the Warner sisters never seemed able to recover from the staggering financial reverses of 1836. Years later a friend wrote, “One day when sitting with Miss Anna in the old living room she took from one of the cases a shell so delicate that it looked like lace work and holding it in her hand, with eyes dimmed with tears, she said, ‘There was a time when I was very perplexed, bills were unpaid, necessities must be had, and someone sent me this exquisite thing. As I held it I realized that if God could make this beautiful home for a little creature. He would take care of me.’”

For forty years, Susan and Anna conducted Bible classes for cadets at West Point, and both were buried with full military honors. They are the only civilians buried in the military cemetery at West Point. To this day, their home on Constitution Island is maintained by West Point as a museum to their memory.
