**From the Pastor's Desk**

Dear Ones,

Kirk has been feeding the birds. He has several bird feeders set up by the driveway. We get all kinds, small birds to large birds, some are timid, some are down right bossy. The blue jays and crows are especially vocal if Kirk is late getting the peanuts out. Then there are the squirrels, the food is really not meant for them, but we enjoy watching them as well. They do, from time to time manage to hang from the feeders and eat, but mostly then stay on the ground eating the food that is dropped or spills out of the feeders.

This reminds me of a story in Matthew 15:

*Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, "Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us." He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." He answered, "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." Then Jesus answered her, "Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed from that moment. Matthew 25:21-28*

Jesus told the woman that his food (healing) is not meant for her because of the fact that she was a Canaanite and he was sent only for the lost sheep of Israel, he even went as far as calling her a dog that should not have the food meant for his people. However, she persisted with the argument that even dogs eat the crumbs under the table that are left after a meal. Jesus then realized that she believed with her whole heart that he could heal her daughter because of who he was and so she got her wish.

Now, I know that the squirrels aren't thinking in any such theological terms about the left-over food they eat at the bird feeders, but they do believe that when Kirk comes out, they will indeed be fed.

Can we muster up the faith of squirrels? Believing that no matter what our needs are, God will make sure there is enough food for us, even if it's crumbs from another's table?

My wish is that you are fully fed in 2023 and that you have faith that God will provide.

Dear Friends in Christ in the Minnesota Conference,

Earlier, I announced district superintendent appointments effective January 1, 2023 and shared that there would be an announcement to follow.

Effective July 1, 2023, I am appointing the Rev. Dr. Woojae Im district superintendent of the Southern Prairie District. Rev. Dr. Im is currently serving as the pastor of The United Methodist Church of Peace in Richfield. Rev. Dr. Im has served a number of other appointments in the Minnesota Conference, including Christ Korean UMC, Milaca UMC, and Osseo UMC. Prior to appointments in Minnesota, Dr. Im served churches in South Korea. He has served in many leadership roles in the Minnesota Conference, including on the Board of Ordained Ministry, as part of the Minnesota Conference delegation to General and Jurisdictional Conferences, and he is now on the Transitional Table.


Rev. Im's doctor of ministry degree emphasized spiritual formation, and he has also completed the two-year Academy for Spiritual Formation. He recently completed the Practical Church Leadership Program at Dakota Wesleyan University. Rev. Dr. Im has a passionate faith in Jesus Christ and a deep commitment to the vitality of the church. He is committed to the mission, vision, and values of the Minnesota Conference, and thinks it vitally important to remind ourselves that all we do needs to be rooted in Jesus.

I am pleased that Rev. Dr. Im has agreed to be appointed a district superintendent in the Minnesota Conference.

With this announcement, I also want to express my profound gratitude to the Rev. Dr. Fred Vanderwerf for his faithful and effective service as the Southern Prairie District Superintendent for the past eight years. As mentioned in my previous superintendent announcement, the service of a district superintendent is limited to eight years. In his time on the cabinet, Rev. Dr. Vanderwerf has been a passionate advocate for evangelism and church growth. He feels deeply about the need for the Minnesota Conference and The United Methodist Church to remain rooted in Jesus and grounded in Wesleyan theology as we also pursue justice, reconciliation, and inclusivity. He continually brings the needs of the pastors and churches of his district to the attention of the cabinet. He has been well-loved and deeply respected by his district and cabinet colleagues. I am excited to see where Jesus may be calling him next in ministry.

I ask again that during this Advent season, as we prepare for fresh arrivals of the Christ and we prepare as a conference for our future, that you join me in keeping Bishop Lanette Plambeck, Rev. Dr. Vanderwerf, and Rev. Dr. Im in your prayers.
