Church Re-Opening

If you remember, back on Sunday November 22nd, the difficult decision was announced that COVID 19 was out of control in the State of Minnesota and Waseca County and at noon the church was going to Red Phase which meant complete close down of the church for inperson worship and meetings. We know it has been hard not to gather during Advent Season, but we want to give a special "Thank You" to those who helped with the worship service so we could all see the service out on the church website or through You Tube.

We are happy to announce the re-opening of in person worship service starting this coming Sunday, January 17th. Worship will continue to be at 9:30AM with many of the same restrictions still in place.

The restrictions that will be followed are:

- Everyone <u>must wear</u> a face mask while anywhere inside the church at all times, unless you have a medical reason not to.
- Have individuals use hand sanitizer, take their own bulletin, and go directly to the pew; also use the hand sanitizer when leaving the sanctuary.
- We will be using every other pew and sit in only those pews that have been marked with blue tape. Do not pass attendance books down; there is one on each outside edge of the pew.
- Drinking foundations will continue to be shut off and covered.
- Offering plates will be set out by each exit to place your offering into.
- Ushers will be dismissing you by rows starting in the back of the church and moving forward.
- After each event or worship, the church will go through a thorough cleaning before it can be used again.
- No choir at this time because of social distancing and some underlying health issues of the choir members.
- No serving of food either after worship service, circle meetings and other church meetings.
- We encourage all church meetings to be held in Fellowship Hall so we can keep our physical social distancing.

We are also encouraging anyone who is not feeling well to stay home and come to worship when you are feeling better.

We would like to make the worship service little more interactive, so we would like to try to have one hymn for the congregation to sing with their mask on. The other element we would like to add in is saying the Lord's Prayer out loud with mask on.

If you have any questions or concerns please contact Pastor Carolyn, Jarod True or Dave Baldini. Thank you for understanding during these difficult times and we hope and pray the future looks better for all of us to get back to new normal times.

End of Year Here at Last

We are pleased to report that the final payment for our 2020 Apportionments was sent to the Minnesota Conference in December. That makes two years in a row that we have been able to pay 100% of our Apportionments. After last year, the Conference rewarded us by forgiving 25% of our delinquent amount that had accumulated over several years. That forgiveness was over \$28,000.

On December 14, we were able to deposit over \$4000 for gifts that had been sent in during the previous week. This was a real "shot in the arm" to help us pay our regular operating bills including the wages for our staff. If you still have some balance of the amount you intended for Faith Church this year, we encourage you to send it in soon. Every amount received is needed and gratuitously accepted.

Any payments that were received or postmarked by December 31 were recorded in 2020. Those received after that time will be recorded in 2021.
