From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Ones,

As you know, I had knee replacement surgery on June 1. I'm here to tell you that they trick you at the hospital. When you go to the operating room, the anesthesiologist gives you a spinal block, then some nice gentle medicine that makes you take a nice nap, then when you wake up, they inject a pain block into your knee. When I got back to my room, I felt great! I could not believe I felt so good after a major surgery. I had lunch while waiting for the spinal to wear off. Then I got dressed, no problem, I got up and walked, went up and down stairs, I still felt great! Then Kirk brought the car around and we left for home. Now, the physical therapist did tell me that my knee would feel painful, but I didn't really listen because I felt so good. On the way home, the pain meds started wearing off and by the time we got home, everything had changed for me. I felt an incredible amount of pain. And for several days, the pain level was very high. Of course, things are much better now, and the pain is under control.

I told this story on my last Sunday in church because it reminds me of our lives in this world. When something happens, the world is very good at throwing "pain meds" at us, promising that if we do this or that, hang out with certain people, eat certain foods, drink certain drinks, our pain will go away. For a while, it works, and we feel better, but soon the world's "pain meds" wear off and we are left with nothing but pain. When I related this in church, I asked the question, "how can Christians deal with the pains we encounter in life? Without hesitation Les answered this question with one word, "Jesus" Les is a smart man. When we walk with Jesus, will he take our pain away? No because it takes pain for us to heal. But Jesus will help us through our pain as we heal. Jesus will not leave us nor forsake us.

I had another "God prod" right before my surgery. On the day we had the Stewart funeral at church a kitten was found in our parking lot. I think it was the teachers from Hansel and Gretel that found him, I can't really remember, but they said they would take him to Canine Central, which is a perfectly fine solution to a lost kitten, they would make sure he saw a vet and help him get adopted, but when I saw his little orange face, I said, "I will take him" and I put him in my office till everything wrapped up at the church, then I took him home, and Kirk fell in love with him too. Now, you all know that I love cats and this kitten has been such a blessing to me as I am recovering from surgery. He is an absolute delight. Maybe the sweetest kitten I have ever had. And research has shown that a cat's purring can have therapeutic benefits for the cat and its owner. These vibrations can help promote the healing of soft tissue injuries in humans. So I believe that my little LeRoy was a gift to me from the Holy Spirit. You might think that's crazy, but that's my story and I'm sticking to it.

I had an amazing last Sunday with all of you! Thank you for the delicious brunch and all the cards and gifts. I am truly humbled by your generosity. I will miss each one of you and pray that great things happen for Faith United Methodist Church.

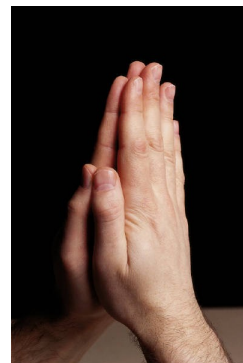

POLICY FOR LENDING OUT TABLES AND FOLDING CHAIRS

Guidelines:

1. Order of priority to lend out items would be first active members of the church, second priority would be former members of the church and lastly would be individuals from the community of Waseca.

3. Let the church office know how many tables/chairs you need, what day you need them, and when and who will be picking them up on what date and the date they will be returned back to the church.
4. Would like to have this information two weeks in advance of the date these items will be picked up from the church.
5. Please leave all your contact information with the church so if you call and no one is in the office we can get back in touch with you in a timely matter.
6. We would ask that a free will offering be made to help with replacement cost for the future so we can continue to provide this service for other individuals' events.
