Minnesota Annual Conference Guidelines for Re-Opening

With our Minnesota Annual Conference guidelines in re-opening the church there are 5 different phases that we have to meet before we can move to the next phase. With each new phase we must submit a written plan to the District Superintendent for his/her approval and they normally come back with follow-up questions. These phases can also be reversible if we don't follow the guidelines we had in our written plan or there is a spike in COVID-19 cases in the state or within our region.

During the last three months we came to understand, like never before, that the church is not a building but it is the people who make up the church. These acts have been shown many times during this period of time how people have looked out for one another.

We would like to share with the congregation some of the obvious guidelines for each of the different phases.

Red Phase (When we closed down the church in the middle of March):

Some of the guidelines were as follows:

- Churches needed to worship online only.
- Pastoral care visits should be done by phone or online only.
- Staff, leadership team, ministry team, youth group and all other groups meetings should be done virtually.
- Weddings and funerals should be postponed if at all possible.
- Outdoor wedding and graveside services could be conducted provided no more than 10 people are gathered and needed to keep social distancing and family units remained six feet apart from one another.
- Church volunteers needed to cease activities that require them to leave their homes.
- Clergy can leave their home in order to do essential work that cannot be done remotely.

Orange Phase (Moved into this phase with our Parking Lot worship service on Sunday June 7th):

Some of the guidelines were as follows:

- Churches are encouraged to worship online and/or through drive-up worship service in which people gather in parking lots without ever leaving their vehicles.
- Groups can worship outdoors if strict social distancing of six feet on each side of each person is maintained and attendees wear face masks.
- Not more than 25% of church capacity to meet outside.

- Recording or live streaming of worship can be done from church provided that there are no more than 10 people and that everyone wears face masks and everyone keeps social distancing.
- In person wedding and funerals may be conducted provided no more than 10 people are gathered indoors and they must follow social distancing guidelines and remain six feet apart from one another.
- Groups should continue to meet virtually as much as possible and pastoral care visits should be done by phone or online as much as possible.
- Small groups of up to 10 people are permitted to gather in person in large areas and must keep their social distancing.
- After each event the areas must be thoroughly sanitized with special attention to restrooms.
- No singing of hymns while inside the church or in small group meetings
- Church staff should work from home as much as possible.

Yellow Phase (Moved into this phase on Sunday June 14th with worship inside the Church and Currently in this phase):

Some of the guidelines that need to be followed:

- No more than 25% of the building capacity for worship and we may need to have people sitting in the choir loft or up in the balcony to keep the social distancing.
- Everyone must wear a face mask while inside the church at all times, unless you have a medical reason not to.
- Have individuals use the hand sanitizer and take their own bulletin and go directly to the pew and also use the hand sanitizer leaving the sanctuary.
- Keep social distancing in the pews and do not pass the attendance books down as there is one on each outside edge of the pew.
- There will be no singing of hymns during the service.
- Announcements and special prayer requests can be emailed to the church or call the pastor.
- If you need to use the restroom while at church there will hand wipes and we ask that you wipe any surface which you may have touched. Please leave the door open after you leave the restroom.
- Drinking fountains have been shut off and covered.
- Offering plates will be set out by each exit to place your offering into.

- Children's Time, children should not come forward. Instead, create from you-to-the-pew story moments engaging children from safe distancing.
- Ushers will be dismissing you by rows starting in the back of the church and moving forward.
- No outside group for non church events or meetings. Church meetings shall be no more than 10 people.
- After each event or worship service the church will go through a thorough cleaning before it can be used again.
- Funerals, weddings, graduation and confirmation celebrations pay special attention to limited guests and keeping proper physical distancing.

Blue Phase: (Next step for us):

Some of the guidelines that need to be followed:

- COVID-19 is still circulating but the infection is low and somewhat larger gathering can take place with capacity restrictions and physical distancing requirements.
- Churches offer both in-person and online worship so those with significant risk factors have an option for remote participation.
- Continue all sanitation practices from the previous phases. All toys and materials in the nursery and children's areas should be cleaned after each use.
- Continue to use no-touch alternatives for passing the peace and greeting each other. This includes the greeters before the worship service and the pastor after the worship service.
- Serve communion in individual cups and pre-cut bread or wafer. (This has been ordered and waiting for them to ship the packages to us).
- Serve food on single-use dishes and with single serving utensils. (Best to use paper plates and plastic utensils).
- More guidelines will be coming down both from the state and also our conference. (Once we have them we will share those additional requirements with you).

Green Phase: (Last phase in re-opening the church up):

Some of the guidelines that need to be followed:

- COVID-19 is no longer considered a risk, and there are no limitations on group size.
- Churches, meetings can gather with no restrictions.
- Continue the excellent protocols for hygiene and sanitation that have been developed in the earlier phases in order to do all we can to minimize illness and ensure parishioners' health and safety.

- Continue to provide multiple avenues of engagement through online and in-person in accessibility for all persons and to reach more people in the name of Christ.
- More guidelines will be coming down both from the state and also our conference. (Once we have them we will share those additional requirements with you).

We understand that these guidelines will be stressful for all of us. We need to say a special “Thank You” to the congregation for hanging in there with us, writing an encouraging note to one another, telephone calls, and any of special acts of kindness that were shown to each other and will continue to show in the future.


