This wilderness time recorded in Luke 4:1-13 tells us that "Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them he was hungry." During this time the Holy Spirit was preparing

		While in the wilderness Jesus was engaged in a spiritual battle with His adver- sary, Satan. Jesus fought this battle using the spiritual practices of fasting, prayer, meditation on the word of God and total dependence on the Holy Spirit to overcome all the schemes of the Evil One.

Over the years the church has practiced the following spiritual practices during Lent:

- 1. Repentance.
- 2. Prayer and Fasting.
- 3. Reading, mediation on and study of the scriptures.
- 4. Personal Reflection and Thanksgiving.
- 5. The Practice of Reconciliation with God and our Brothers and Sisters.
- 6. Regular attendance of worship services.
- 7. Holy Communion.
- 8. Small Group Bible Study.

As we enter the season of Lent I encourage you:

- 1. To ask Jesus what He is calling you to do;
- 2. To ask the Holy Spirit to reveal and areas in your life where you need to repent or any person you need to forgive or ask their forgiveness;
- 3. To show you where God leading you to be involved in the lives of others.
