- \* I follow Christ in the Methodist tradition because of the balance between present and future salvation.
- \* I follow Christ in the Methodist tradition because of the method that is embedded in our heritage.
- "John Wesley said that the characteristics that marked a Methodist are "the common principles of ...plain, old Christianity." So, what is unique about being a disciple of Jesus Christ in the united Methodist Church?"

### The Holy Spirit at the Cross by the Lake



Our cross by the lake is a powerful symbol during the Easter season of Christ's sacrifice for us. But at Faith Church it reminds us all year long of Christ's presence in our lives. We hang drapes on the cross to signify the different liturgical seasons and events. Lake traffic sees that cross and visitors pause beside it. Perhaps photos are taken. It's part of our identity at 'The Church by the Lake'. It's another way we proclaim our faith to the community. We are proud of that cross. We made it! But we really didn't make it at all, the Holy Spirit did! Let me explain:

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> used a member of the Church Council some twenty years ago to tell the council about a church he knew of that had a cross by a lake. And that congregation had outdoor services there. The council agreed that it was a good idea for us, however no action could be taken at the time.

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> (fifteen years later) inspired our men's group to take on the cross project. However, they couldn't agree on what kind of material would be proper for a facsimile of the crucifixion cross, until......

The Holy Spirit reminded one member that the Root River Hardwoods company from Albert Lea would have large, rugged white oak timbers. Problem solved. But when the price was determined, where will we get the money?

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> touched the hearts of two donors who covered the timber bill. But how would we transport the timbers from Albert Lea to Waseca?

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> arranged for one church member to rent a large trailer and use his truck to bring the timbers to Faith Church. You may remember those timbers lying on the north side of the church until.......

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> brought a carpenter from our church forward and with the help of many willing hands and machinery from his boss he assembled the cross, dug the large hole for it, and erected and braced the cross until the hole was backfilled. Concrete for backfill was donated by the local concrete plant.

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> gave ownership and stewardship of the cross to the entire congregation when they were requested to bring rocks to lay at the base of the cross.

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> convinced one church member that the cross needed a seat for visitors to sit and pray when they visited the cross, so, there is a bench there now that fits in with the simple ruggedness of the cross. And finally.......

<u>The Holy Spirit</u> entered the heart of a parishioner who, last year, donated money to have an electrical line trenched from the church to the cross. This provides electricity for dusk-to-dawn lighting of the cross, as well as, power for outdoor services!

So, instead of naming individuals who were involved with the cross project, when someone asks you who built the cross, tell them **The Holy Spirit!** 

### March Campaign to Benefit the Waseca Neighborhood Service Center


# DO YOU WANT TO FAST THIS LENT?
