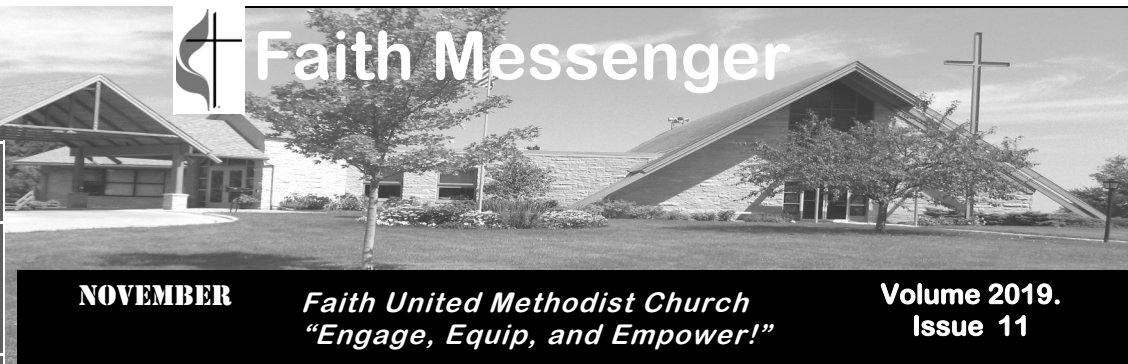

Thoughts on Grace

2 Corinthians 12: 7-10

.... 7 b Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. 8 Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. 9 But he said to me, **“My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.”** Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ’s power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ’s sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

- Grace is the free and unmerited favor of God as demonstrated in the salvation of sinners and the conferring of blessings to all who accept Jesus as their savior’.
- How many times is “grace” mentioned in the Bible? Grace mentioned in about 200 verses, in the Bible.
- Grace is free for all. “What’s So Amazing About Grace?” is a 1997 book by Philip Yancey, an American journalist and editor-at-large for Christianity Today. In it, Yancey coined the phrase “scandal of grace”, because no matter the sins of the sinner, no one is irredeemable.
- Grace means that you can quit feeling inadequate. You’re not perfect, and you’ll never be in this life. You need God’s grace to give you a correct of your life, your circumstances, and everything around you as God does.

GRACE DOES NOT MEAN YOU WILL BECOME SINLESS BUT THAT AS YOU LIVE BY THE SPIRIT YOU WILL SIN LESS.

- What is the difference between grace and mercy? Mercy is God not punishing us as our sins deserve, and grace is God blessing us despite the fact that we do not deserve it. “Mercy is deliverance from judgment. Grace is extending kindness to the unworthy.”
- Grace received in our life is to be grace given to others. We cannot understand grace if we do not freely give it to those who offend us.

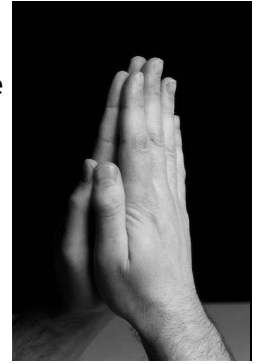

“Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, Communion without confession, absolution without personal confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate.....

Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow, and it is grace because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of his Son: "ye were bought at a price," and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price to pay for our life, but delivered him up for us. Costly grace is the Incarnation of God.”— Dietrich Bonhoeffer, The Cost of Discipleship

Let us know the costliness of grace and the freedom that Grace gives us each day to live like Jesus.

Volunteer Opportunities

Have you been wanting to volunteer your time to help the church but are not sure where help is needed or the time commitment? Your help would be appreciated in the following areas:

Liturgist - If you don't mind speaking in front of a group, you can lead the responsive reading and scripture reading at Sunday morning worship. The current rotation is once every 6 to 8 weeks, dependent on the number of volunteers we have. The next rotation will begin in January, with the schedule being made in mid December. A bulletin will be provided to you a few days before the Sunday service. If this interests you, please contact Stacy in the church office to be put on the schedule.

Nursery Attendant - Do you enjoy working with children? If so, you could volunteer to be a nursery attendant during Sunday morning worship service and supervise a small group children in the nursery. The current rotation for this duty is once every 4 to 5 weeks, dependant upon the number of volunteers. The next rotation schedule for this opportunity will also begin in January. Newsletter Folder - This group normally meets the last Wednesday of the month at 10:00 am in the church office to collate and fold the church newsletter to prepare it for mailing. We have some experienced helpers who will show you what to do. It's also a great time of fellowship. The task normally takes 1 to 2 hours depending on the number of volunteers that attend. An announcement will be put in the bulletin the Sunday before folding as a reminder or you can contact Stacy and be put on the email list of helpers who are contacted a couple of weeks before folding.

Bulletin Board - Do you have a creative side you would like to share and help welcome people into the church? We are always looking for volunteers to decorate the bulletin board in the Narthex. You can sign up for a month or two at a time. The sign-up sheet is located near the UMW bulletin board, or you can contact Stacy in the church office to check what months need to be filled.

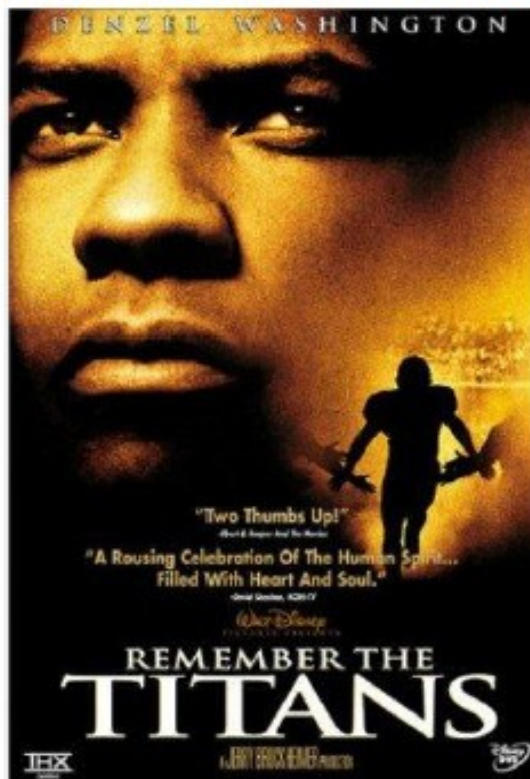
After attending 'The Vietnam Experience' presentation at the Senior Center, you can check out the newly completed Waseca Veterans Memorial across the street by the Court House.
