Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. John 14:6 (KJV)

That verse in John 14:6, says that Jesus is *the way*. If we are Christians, we already know that because that is how we came to Salvation. Jesus is the only way. But after accepting Salvation, how much have we really put into the effort to know Jesus better?

If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven.² "So when you give to the needy, do not announce it with trumpets, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and on the streets, to be honored by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full.³ But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Love: (Matthew 22:35-40)

³⁵ One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

³⁷ Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.⁴ ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.⁴ ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Survey question 1 – When you think about our church, what brings us joy?
